## AFFIRMATIVE FORM (+)

## NEGATIVE FORM (-)

<u>FULL FORM</u>	<u>SHORT FORM</u>
I <b>will not</b> go there.	I <b>won't</b> go there.
You <b>will not</b> go there.	You <b>won't</b> go there.
He <b>will not</b> go there.	He <b>won't</b> go there.
She <b>will not</b> go there.	She <b>won't</b> go there.
It <b>will not</b> go there.	It <b>won't</b> go there.
We <b>will not</b> go there.	We <b>won't</b> go there.
You <b>will not</b> go there.	You <b>won't</b> go there.
They <b>will not</b> go there.	They <b>won't</b> go there.
